The NSS is for families who want to ease the pressure inherent with traditional school offerings that cannot support or accommodate student-athlete needs including academics, training, and competitions.

The National Sport School provides a supportive environment to enable developing high-performance athletes to mature as self-directed, life-long learners while pursuing excellence in sport.

For 26 years, the National Sport School has brought together a community of like-minded student-athletes, families and educators. In 2021, the National Sport School joined The Palliser School Division (Palliser).

Student Eligibility

Student-athletes in grades 8-12* will find the flexibility and learning environment to optimize their academic success. They are involved in sport that is usually recognized at the Provincial or National level and therefore spend a lot of time dedicated to their athletic pursuits. We recognize the unique challenges of school programming designed around training and competition and the need to both accommodate sport commitments and provide learning opportunities through digital technology, access to teachers and individual attention.

*** New This Year:** *The National Sport School is looking to expand our program to include Grade 8 students for the 2022/23 school year. We will require a minimum of 20 students (1 class) to proceed with this expansion and are accepting applications after the virtual information session. A final decision on if Grade 8 can proceed with the minimum number of students reached will be made by March 31st, 2022.*

Our Learning Environment

The National Sport School provides an accessible, supportive, and flexible learning environment. Small class sizes, tutorials, athlete development, leadership training, flexible program and exam options, as well as unparalleled access to onsite sports services, world-class training facilities, and various funding opportunities are what sets us apart. Students can be both successful athletes and graduate from high school with an exceptional education.

Our hybrid learning environment combines classroom instruction with online technology, allowing students to continue studies when traveling for training or competition.



● Our ● Location

No other school in Canada is nestled on a campus quite like ours at WinSport. We offer and maintain high-performance facilities where the world's best come to train and compete. The location at WinSport's Canada Olympic Park offers a unique duality: premier training facilities collaborating with an onsite esteemed school. Another advantage is that our academic institution is part of a public education system. All of this opportunity remains exceptionally accessible for families with varying financial means.

WinSport's indoor and outdoor training facilities offer world class training venues in skating and hockey, ski, snowboard and sliding sports. These facilities provide varied training opportunities our student-athletes need to achieve their potential. Professional services through the Performance Training Centre and Canadian Sport Institute, expert coaches, nutritionists, a yoga instructor and other benefits are services our students have access to. Through the Performance Training Centre, the athlete's Yearly Training Plan (YTP) is supported through on-site access to training. The Group 23 medical clinic onsite allows our student athletes to recover in a supportive sport environment and deal with the physical and mental challenges often associated with injury and recovery.

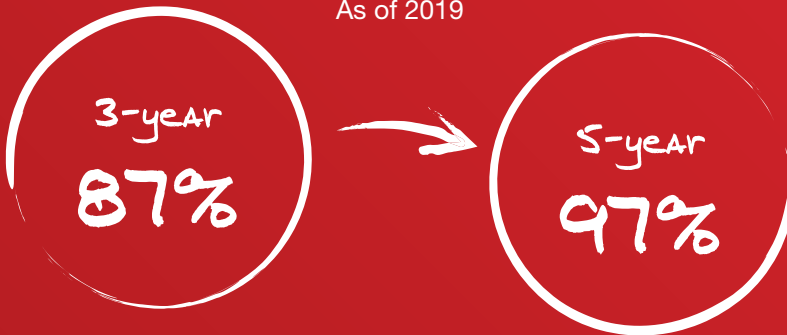
According to the 2019 Fraser Institute ranking, the NSS ranked eighth out of 20 Calgary High Schools with a score of 7.9/10

● Application ● Process

The National Sport School has student-athletes in nearly 30 different disciplines in both summer and winter sports. Our school works closely with national and provincial sport organizations in the selection of our student-athletes. We recognize approvals and endorsements from these organizations as part of our overall application process. We work with these organizations to ensure that their overall objectives for their athletes are included in their personalized annual training plans.

If your student-athlete is a fit for National Sport School, please complete your application. The initial application intake deadline is March 25th, 2022.

Regular applications may also be considered pending the number of remaining placements available after this spring application, interview, assessment and enrollment process has been completed.

How to Apply

1. [Complete the application package](#) including the \$260.75 non-refundable application fee. Please select either the Sport Specific stream or General Athleticism stream.
2. Individual Evaluation: The prospective student athlete will interview (virtually) with sport and academic representatives from the National Sport School and WinSport.
3. Upon receipt of written notification of provisional acceptance, complete the National Sport School enrollment package. This step also includes payment of the National Sport School Alternative Program fee of \$4,990.
