Dean Brody to hit the stage at WinSport's Event Centre

CALGARY, Alta. – WinSport is pleased to announce that Canadian country star Dean Brody is coming to the WinSport Event Centre at Canada Olympic Park on Friday, March 24, 2023.

Tickets for the special night of outstanding country music, starting at just \$59.99 (not including taxes and fees), are available starting at 10 a.m. on Thursday, Dec. 22, at ticketmaster.ca.

Brody, a passionate storyteller, and unmatched lyricist continues to dominate the Canadian country landscape with 33 top-10 singles, including eight that climbed to Number 1 on the charts. In addition to 18 Canadian Country Music Awards and two Juno Awards, Brody is the most consumed Canadian artist since 2020.

His debut single Brothers cracked the top 40 in the U.S. in 2008 and he has continued to own the Canadian stage, headlining some of Canada's top music festivals and selling out venues across the country. In addition to his outstanding work on stage and in the studio, Brody dedicates significant time to his philanthropic efforts through his charity The Dean Brody Foundation (deanbrody.com/),

The concert, presented by WinSport in cooperation with Livestar Entertainment, includes special guest Tyler Joe Miller. Since his gold-certified debut single Pillow Talk in 2019, Miller has taken the Canadian country music scene by storm with his follow-up single I Would Be Over Me Too climbing the charts and earning him the honour as the first independent Canadian country artist to reach Number 1 at radio with their first two singles. He was nominated for four 2021 CCMA Awards including Album of the Year.
