WinSport's Servus Tube Park opens Saturday for winter season

CALGARY, Alta. – WinSport is excited to announce the highly anticipated opening of the Servus Tube Park for the winter season on Saturday, Dec. 23.

WinSport's snowmaking team has been busy taking advantage of every weather window to ensure the tube park can open for its seventh season of operation. The tube park is located on the east side of Canada Olympic Park, and features seven groomed lanes of fun, with a dedicated magic carpet to take guests back up to the top of the hill.

Three two-hour sessions (10 a.m., 12:30 p.m. and 3 p.m.) are available on Saturdays and Sundays throughout the winter, with closing day currently scheduled for March 31, 2024. The tube park will be open daily during the holiday season, except for Christmas Day, from Dec. 23 to Jan. 7, with three sessions daily.

Thanks to WinSport's partnership with Servus Credit Union, Servus Tube Park Fridays are returning this season, where guests enjoy 40% off regular-priced tube park tickets on seven dedicated Friday nights. The first Servus event is Jan. 12, with sessions at 4 p.m. and 6:30 p.m.

Guests are encouraged to purchase tickets online in advance at winsport.ca as each session is capped to limit capacity. Tickets can then be picked up at the dedicated Servus Tube Park ticket booth and entrance, which is located by the northeast corner of the Frank King Day Lodge parking lot.

Please note that the minimum age requirement is four years old, with a minimum height requirement of 36 inches/92 centimetres tall. Children below this height are not permitted to ride.

Helmets are recommended for all riders. Guests may bring their own or rentals are available.
