Humpty's Champions Cup tickets now on sale

CALGARY, Alta. – WinSport is excited to announce that tickets are now on sale for the Humpty's Champions Cup, the season finale of the Pinty's Grand Slam of Curling series.

The event runs April 25-30, 2017, and showcases all the top winners on tour over the course of the season in one final showdown. All participating teams will have won at least one high-profile tournament, which is part of the qualifying process.

Tickets are available at ticketmaster.ca at a special early bird price of \$236.25 (plus fees), which includes admission to all 18 draws including tiebreakers. The early bird price is only available until the beginning of January, 2017.

Last year's Champions Cup winners, Winnipeg's Team Jennifer Jones along with Reid Carruthers, will defend their titles at this year's event. Jones captured the inaugural cup women's title this past season defeating Ottawa's Team Rachel Homan in the final while Carruthers edged Toronto's Team John Epping in a thrilling second extra end to become the first men's champion.

Also booking their ticket to the WinSport event is Team Allison Flaxey of Caledon, Ont., which upset defending champ Homan at the WFG Masters last weekend in Okotoks, Alta., to capture their first career Pinty's Grand Slam of Curling title. Niklas Edin and his Swedish foursome claimed the men's crown in Okotoks to earn a trip to the finale.

In addition to watching the some of the best curling teams in the world compete in WinSport's world-class facility, fans will also be able to mingle with other fans at the Grand Slam Social House and Pinty's Pub and Grill Zone.
